## *A Word From the Interim Rector*

“Resurrection” literally means “standing up again.” As we approach Holy Week and Easter, the Scriptures tell us that resurrection is one of the Spirit’s major energies in human life. Jesus suffered everything that the powers of evil could hurl against him, but “stood up” with compassion and dignity all through it, then was “raised” to stand in power from the darkness of death. The disappointed and discouraged disciples were raised to stand courageously by the Risen Christ’s presence among and within them, just as ancient Israel had been raised from slavery’s oppression in Egypt to stand up as a people. The Spirit of the Risen One is the power that helps any of us stand up with compassion and courage for justice and the well-being of others. Celebrate this great Story of Resurrection by walking through Holy Week with us at St. Peter’s!

## *Easter Lessons and Carols*

New this year will be an Easter Lessons and Carols service, with Holy Communion, at 10 a.m. April 23, the Sunday after Easter Day. Instead of a sermon, we will hear readings which present, on one day, the whole sweep of Jesus’ many resurrection appearances, hear Eastertide anthems, and sing a variety of Eastertide hymns. Like our Advent Lessons and Carols, this can be a great way for you to internalize the message of Easter in all its grandeur. Christ is risen, and meets us any time we worship the God he proclaimed.

## *March Vestry Notes*

The Vestry met on Wednesday, March 15 at 7:30 for its regular monthly meeting.

**Elected** Kimberley Butler to the Vestry to fill the unexpired term of Peter Torok.

**Elected** Pam Bayard as alternative Vestry.

**Accepted** Betty McGovern’s resignation letter as Nursery School Head, with thanks for her service. Betty will step down as head in June. A Nursery School search committee is being formed, with Vestryperson Serena Watkinson representing the Vestry.

**Received a report** from the Building and Grounds committee and recommended that the Committee prepare a long-range plan and budget for the maintenance of the buildings.

**Reviewed and accepted** the proposed 3-year budget to present to the Diocese, which demonstrates that St. Peter’s can afford a full-time Rector.

**Approved** a 2% rise in salary for the Parish Secretary, Organist and Buildings Manager.

**Approved** shifting insurance for the truck from Church Insurance to Progressive. The truck is used often for transporting OpShop items and Christmas gifts.

**Reviewed and Accepted** Warden Mark Livingston's report on the church Balance Sheet, showing a total of 1.4 Million dollars in investments. Current investment income of the aggregate of all accounts is 4.35%. This includes donor restricted funds like the David St. George and Needy People funds, which can only be used for those purposes. The Finance Committee will begin a process of more clearly allotting investment income proportionally to all the various funds.

**Approved** a proposal to take a percentage of the income for the Garth (where remains of the departed are interred) for general uses. The balance of the income is used for the maintenance of the Garth.

**Received** the Interim Rector's report detailing his plans to emphasize the ways in which St. Peter's can grow as a community of mutual support, the Communications new committee's work under Pat Sheeleigh's leadership to promote the parish as a place where "Faith in Action" is prized. The Rector also announced that there will be a "Minute for Ministry" testimony from a parish layperson once a month at the 10 a.m. Eucharist in the months to come. Vince Corso gave the first in March on his ministry as Pastoral Assistant.
