A Word from the Interim Rector: Easter Continues!

Easter is not a one-day wonder! Just as Christ's resurrection was revealed over fifty days of appearances, teaching and empowerment, so also our Easter celebration continues for seven Sundays until the next great Festival Day, Pentecost on June 4. St. Paul tells us that "the first Adam was given breath, but the second Adam became a life-giving Spirit," and the whole season celebrates Christ's continuing work of resurrection in human lives: people rising from despair to hope, from sickness to restored health, from selfish destructiveness to lives of compassion and service. Christ-power is available to all who will receive it!

As part of our Eastertide 2017, I hope you will come to one or more of these special events:

Labyrinth Walk — Saturday, May 6

The quiet and meditative path of the Labyrinth (not a maze) allows heart and mind of mull over and meditate on a chosen theme (such as things to be grateful for, or my relationship to God, or answers to a particular issue I'm facing). The path of the Labyrinth always leads to the "God-center" at its center, but the winding path mirrors the winding paths of our mind, and of our journey through time. A portable Labyrinth will be spread in the Upper Room on Saturday, May 6, 10 am - 3 pm. with quiet music playing in the background. You'll be given a brief set of suggestions for a labyrinth walk, and the Chapel will be open if you wish some time to pray afterwards.

"Life After Life" Forum — Sunday May 7

From 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 a.m. after the 10 a.m. Eucharist, Fr. Morris will give a special presentation on Christian teachings and insights about life after physical death, and the meaning of "eternal life" for Christians. He will also draw on present-day experiences of "near-death experiences," both from the literature, and people he has known personally. "The human race may know more about what happens at the threshold of death than we realize," says Fr. Morris. Come with your own ideas and questions for this informative session.

What is North Porch?

The North Porch Women and Infant's Center, run through the Episcopal Diocese of Newark provide seven-day emergency supplies of formula, baby food, diapers, wipes and clothing for needy mothers and infants in the Newark, Paterson, Hackettstown, Clifton and Dover areas. The name reflects the custom of the ancient church to regard the "North Porch" as a gathering place and refuge for women.

How Does North Porch Serve Needy Families

They provide a seven-day supply of infant items in order to help needy mothers stabilize and improve their lives. They have a part-time social worker that works with these mothers providing counseling, parenting classes and job referral materials.

What Can We Do To Help - Bring

Vestry Notes - At its April 19 meeting, the Vestry:

Welcomed Kimberly Butler as a new Vestry person to work on Membership Development.

Received an investment income report from Warden Mark Livingston showing total investments of 1.4 Million dollars up 5.2 % for the year so far.

Approved a resolution for the purchase of new burial urns to be used in the Garth.

Approved a resolution to use a percentage of the Garth Fund for the upkeep of the related Memorial Garden in the rear of the Church property.

Looks with favor on a proposal from Pam Au to sell Christmas ornaments with an image of the new stained glass window in honor of The Rev. Stephanie Wethered, and encouraged her committee to request a prototype of the ornament.

Approved a revision to Fr. Morris' contract, extending his time through August 31, 2017, and adding a third vacation week as appropriate to the extension.

Received the text of the Nursery School Board's Ad for a new Director, with accompanying job description, and discussed honoring the retiring Director Betty McGovern at a 10 a.m. service this spring.

Received the Budget Committee's quarterly report of income and expenses. Thus far, overall expenditures are in line with budget projections, and income is within normal cash flow norms.

Reviewed the proposed 3-year budget protection required by the Diocese of Newark.

Discussed ways in which to encourage more on-line giving, including automatic payment from parishioners bank accounts and **recommended** that quarterly statements be sent to pledgers.

Approved a resolution to assembly a notebook for all Vestry members with all Vestry duties and responsibilities, and background information about how Vestries in the Episcopal Church are to conduct their business.

Urged the updating of the pictorial parish directory and its restoration to the website.
